## NEED TO KNOW **To ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone, please make your campers aware of the following:**

- There is zero tolerance for illegal drugs, alcohol, or firearms on campus.
- Our campus is tobacco-free.
- No water balloons, silly string, nerf guns, water guns, or fireworks on campus.
- Do not enter the rooms or hallways of the opposite gender.
- Curfew is 11 p.m.
- CSU students live in the residence halls year-round. Please respect their privacy.
- Windows must remain closed and locked at all times, and blinds must be closed after dark.
- Lock your room door and bathroom door at all times.
- Do not move or disassemble furniture.
- Take all trash to the dumpsters.
- Air conditioning should remain at a normal level. If the AC unit is set to high cool and the coldest temperature, the unit will freeze. Upon check out make sure your unit is set to 72 degrees cool.
- Do not flush anything besides toilet paper to avoid sewage backups.
- The Quads are furnished with dehumidifiers. Please empty the removable buckets to ensure continuous operation.
- Any vehicle entering campus after midnight must use the stadium entrance and will be required to present the vehicle pass provided during registration.
- Please be aware of the ongoing construction projects and remind your campers to avoid these areas.
- The lost key fee is \$30 per key and lost fobs are \$25 per fob.
- A \$100 fine will be issued for excessive mess or any disassembled or broken furniture during checkout.

## CAMPUS LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES



When a credible threat has been identified, the emergency alert system will be initiated and the campus will be placed on lockdown. When this occurs, the following steps will be taken:

All entrances and exits to the campus will be sealed off and no vehicle or pedestrian traffic will be permitted on or off campus for the duration of the lockdown. Simultaneously with the emergency alert, Residence Life personnel will work with camp leaders and security to ensure that everyone knows that a campus emergency is in progress and that all persons should remain in their rooms until further advised. University personnel will be dispatched to every building on campus that is open or occupied and notify the person in charge of that facility that the doors should be locked and no one should be permitted to enter or exit until the all-clear has been sounded. Security personnel will advise any persons outside to immediately seek a safe place to stay for the duration of the crisis.

Once the senior official on scene has determined that the threat has been neutralized and the emergency is over, an emergency alert message will be sent to all registered users. Another notification will be issued through Residence Life or Security to advise all residential students that the threat is over and they are free to move about at will. The occupants of all buildings previously secured will be advised to resume normal operations. All entrances and exits to the campus will be re-opened.

## SEVERE WEATHER INFORMATION



**WATCH:** Severe weather is possible in and near the watch area. Stay informed and be ready to act if a severe thunderstorm or tornado warning is issued.

**WARNING:** Severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings indicate imminent danger to life and property. Stop what you are doing and take shelter immediately. A tornado can strike with little or no warning.

The safest location in the event of severe weather is in the interior of the first floor of a sturdy building away from windows and doors. Interior corridors/hallways are an acceptable second choice if no windowless rooms are available. Residents on the first floor of any building should aid others reaching shelter by leaving doors open during the duration of the weather emergency.

When told of a warning, go immediately to the nearest shelter area. Get on your knees in a tucked position with your hands covering your head. Stay away from windows. Do not be outside unless there is no other choice. If necessary, lie flat in a ditch, culvert, or other low area. Do not leave shelter until the storm has passed.

The designated emergency shelter areas in Women's North, Women's South, Russell East, and Russell West are the first floor hallways. Residents of the Quads should take shelter in first floor bathrooms or closet spaces.
