- All graduate (M.Ed.) programs are offered online.
- The ESOL Endorsement Program seeks non-degree candidates for the January 2024 cohort. ESOL endorsement is 6 hours- 2 classes, which includes a practicum that requires 15 hours of practice in the classroom. Upon completion, candidates can take the Praxis II exam for certification. Classes are offered online.
- Education Administration

The Education Administration for Elementary and Secondary Leadership is an online program with a Saturday internship component that encourages networking and role-playing leadership challenges. This program is aligned with NELP standards. We moved to a 7-week format. While most courses are online, the instructors take great pride in getting to know each candidate personally. It is our goal to inspire and help every candidate be successful.

• Teacher Leadership

We discontinued this program due to a lack of applicants.

Sports Coaching

The Master's in Physical Education and Sports Coaching provides opportunities for current physical education teachers to enhance their skills in teaching and provides an avenue for new coaches to understand the role sports coaches play in developing young athletes.

Graduate candidates in our program will receive the essential skills and knowledge to work with athletes across various contexts across the lifespan. Graduates will be prepared to work in various settings inside and outside of the K-12 and collegiate sports setting.
