POLICY AND REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS TAKING 099 CLASSES	A-3	1 of 1	June 19, 1989

Students may take English 099 and/or Math 099 at CSU during the Fall, Spring, and/or Summer semesters under the following guidelines:

1. Students must complete their required ENGL 099 and/or MATH 099 courses within one calendar year from the beginning of their first attempt in the course. Under no circumstances will a fourth attempt be considered. Withdrawing from an 099 course counts as an attempt.
2. Students who are required to take either ENGL 099 or MATH 099 (or both) must enroll in GNED 107 and at least one of their required ENGL 099 or MATH 099 courses their first semester at the university (unless they successfully completed the course during the prior summer term). Students required to take 099 courses may not withdraw from their required 099 courses. Any exceptions to this policy will only be granted with express written permission of the Chair of the Mathematics or English departments as appropriate.
3. For students accepted prior to Academic Year 2025-26 previous versions of Policy-A-3 as recorded in the Registrar's office apply.

Readmission after Suspension:

Students with a 2.0 GPA or better (099 courses included) at CSU may gain readmission to CSU by simply completing a course deemed equivalent to the appropriate 099 course with a grade of 'C' or better. The Chairs of the Departments of English and/or Mathematics must preapprove the equivalent. Students with a GPA below 2.0 (099 courses included) at CSU will not be eligible to return as above. These students may reapply for admission to the university once they have met the requirements for transfer student admission as specified in the academic catalog: <http://catalog.csuniv.edu/index.php>
